



Core Changes over the last Decade

- The retirement of 65 % of our faculty within a period of 5 years
- A corresponding rearrangement of primary research interests and fields
- An accompanying increased tendency towards interdisciplinary research
- A rapid transition from a one-phase diploma or magister study to a twophase Bachelor/Master degree system
- A slow but steady shift from basic to project funding
- The profound impact of Germany's Federal and State Excellence Initiative since its implementation in 2006

Duration: 2006 – 2012

Total Budget: 1.9 billion Euros

3 Funding Lines

40 Graduate Schools 1 million Euros per graduate school anually

First Funding Line: Graduate Schools

Providing ideal conditions for doctoral students within a broad scientific area and of international visbility

Playing a key role in developing internationally competetive centers of top-level research and scientific excellence in Germany

Encouraging students to be **active members** of their academic and social communities



Second Funding Line: Clusters of Excellence

Establishing internationally visible and highly competetive research and training facilities

Enhancing scientific **networking and cooperation** among participating institutions/departments

Forming an important part of the university's strategic and thematic planning

Raising the profile of the university's long-term priorities



Third Funding Line: Long-Term Institutional Strategies





Breeding grounds for innovative interdisciplinary concepts

Structures in which new **bottom-up ideas** are converted into **externally funded research projects**

Restricted to a 2 year period

Active recruitment of female researchers at all qualification levels


