









• 72% of UC3M 's Bachelor Degrees can be pursued in English or in a bilingual modality.


• A large number of practical classes are conducted in laboratories, computer classrooms, stages, radio stations and courtrooms.

## **GRADUATE SCHOOLS**


- The University has four graduate schools and offers 91 Master's Programmes and 19 PhD programmes.
- 29% of the graduate programmes are bilingual or are offered in English.
- Most of Masters take place in the Madrid-Puerta de Toledo Campus, located in the centre of Madrid.





## LIBRARY

- Provides support to research activities, including open dissemination of our researchers' scientific results.
- Also supports the digital edition of scientific publications.
- Helps with the preparation of teaching materials for MOOCs and SPOCs.



- The University has three residence halls located in the Getafe and Legane's Campuses
- The Auditorium hosts an extensive, year round, cultural programme
- Sport centres with gym, spa, swimming pool and a wide range of activities

# International talent programmes at UC3M

• Chairs of Excellence: since 2008, 126 professors have visited different Departments in the University.

From universities like Stanford, Oxford, Singapore (SNU) or MIT, and from 23 countries.

• CONEX: 28 researchers from 15 countries have joined the Departments and Institutes of UC3M to develop 3- year research projects.

- > UC3M is 1<sup>st</sup> university in Spain participating in Erasmus+
- > For the academic year 2019/20, UC3M offers around 2.624 positions to study abroad in European and non European countries

## Young Universities for the Future of Europe (YUFE)

- > UC3M is part of YUFE, a consortium of eight European universities that aims at bringing a radical change in European higher education by establishing itself as the leading model of a young, student-centred, nonelitist, open and inclusive European University.
- > YUFE was created as a consequence of the **European Universities** Initiative (EUI) launched by the European Commission, aiming to develop and implement the first models for a European University.
