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Introduction

In 2013, new <u>Strategic Directions</u> for the Library were put in place, in line with the new model established the previous year.

- Teaching and Learning
- Research
- Management
- Dissemination of Information and Communication
- Usability and Accessibility
- Training and Development

The goals achieved were:

- Teaching and Learning:

• Coordinating the Unit for Education Technology and Teaching Innovation (UTEID in Spanish) which assists in the creation of MOOCS, online *Cursos Cero* and also in the publication of material providing support and best practices for teachers.

-Research:

- Establishment of support service for teaching faculty during the processes of accreditation and *sexenios* (performance-based pay rises) by providing quality indexes of publications.
- Implementation of the ORCID code in order to identify researchers at UC3M.

-Dissemination of Information and Communication:

- Consolidation of support tools provided by the Library Blogs
 - Usability and Accessibility:
- Renewal of 1st Phase of the Library Web.

- Training and Development:

• Development of the Support Guide for the Completion of the Master's Degree Final Project

Other achievements have been:

- **Opening of the new building** of the Humanities, Communication and Documentation Library in September 2013 after the re-location and reorganization of its collection. Holding about 100,000 items, this has now been further supplemented with the addition of collections previously held in the Social Sciences Library, such as:
 - Collection of philosopher and professor José Luis Aranguren
 - Collection bequeathed by the poet Leopoldo de Luis and heirs
 - Old collection mostly taken from the Bequest (1993) from the former Institute of Legal Sciences at CSIC.

Opening of the <u>new collection in the Centre of Advanced Studies in Social</u> <u>Sciences</u>, donated by the *Fundación Juan March* and held in the Social Sciences Library. Most of these holdings are in the areas of Political and Social Sciences and were published from the 1960s onwards, especially in Europe and the United States. Its 60,000 items have been accessible via the Library catalogue since 2013.

- Opening of a library service in the <u>new Post-Graduate Campus at Madrid-Pta. de</u> <u>Toledo.</u> In September, a process was begun to oversee the access to collections of other Libraries and of electronic resources for students studying their Master's degrees on this Campus.
- Coordination of the *Web Refreshing* Project which has enabled a partial upgrade of the UC3M's web.

Due to the increase in buildings, square metres available and service areas, the distribution of space and primary equipment is as follows:

With the creation of the Library Service at the Madrid-Puerta de Toledo Campus in 2013, Library Service staff are to be placed from September of this year throughout **five centres** or Libraries (as well as the Documentation Centre which is part of the Social Sciences Library). A **redistribution of resources** has been implemented in order to be able to manage, with the same staff, not just the new opening but also the shift from the Humanities Library to a new building (which is larger and offers more user services). Between September and December 2013, a total of seven librarians have changed their location and job position.

While buildings and services for library users run continuously from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., **budget restrictions** have meant that they no longer open on Saturdays, as they did in previous years. On weekends they are open during exam periods, although late-night opening hours from 9:00 p.m. to 12.00 p.m. have been cancelled. For the same reasons, there was a reduction in the number of interns between 2009 and 2013 of 34% (and reduction of 50% in the number of interns in computer rooms at the library).

Also to be noted is the <u>Annual Library Symposium</u>, held as always in February and in two sessions which were attended by all staff. The following Library projects were presented:

- New search engine and website for electronic resources
- Updating of the Intranet
- Technology Unit and Teaching Innovation
- Support for Accreditation and Sexenios (Performance-based pay rises)
- And without doubt: a new channel of information and communication with users

In the context of collaboration between the university Library Networks (Rebuin) and CRUE (TIC), this year the University Library organized the XI CRAI Conference: *Reflections* on the super-convergence of services in the area of higher education in the United Kingdom, held on May 23 and 24 in Madrid.

It has been another year of budget cuts in the acquisitions budget for printed as well as electronic bibliographic holdings, books and journals. The overall **reduction** has been around 20%.

Moreover, the Budgetary Readjustment Plan meant that <u>even more cuts were made</u> to expenses forecasted for this year in the areas of Specialized Information Resources and Library Monographs (recommended bibliography).

If we add the cuts to these two areas to the yearly budget (although this has already been done for spending) we see that there is a reduction 30% with respect to 2012.

It should be also added that for the 2012 academic year there was a <u>50% reduction</u> in the Funding provided by the Regional Government of Madrid for purchases in the Madroño Consortium of university libraries in Madrid. As a result, purchase planning was based solely on the Universities' own Budgets.


Even though negotiations have been conducted with the suppliers of electronic resources in order to obtain a discount in license prices, it has still been necessary to <u>cancel subscriptions</u> to journals and electronic resources previously available:

- Library Access to the online journals of Springer, Emerald and OECD has been cancelled
- Subscriptions to little-used printed journals have been cancelled

<u>What is more, acquisitions of Bibliographies</u> recommended for students NO longer meet previously established levels.

Also, this year there is less money available for Departments to make contributions toward the Inclusions to Specialized Library Collections and also less money that has been managed in bibliography acquisitions under the funding for research projects.




ACQUISITIONS 2013: LIBRARY-DEPARTMENT BUDGETS AND CURRENT DONATIONS

This section covers the mostly printed or audiovisual documentation acquired or received as a current donation during the year. Not included are the 60,000 volumes donated by the *Fundación Juan March*.

Due to ongoing budget cuts, the acquisition of scientific documents continues to decline. This has become especially critical after <u>additional cuts of more than 130,000€</u> <u>during the 2013 academic year.</u>


<u>Recommended bibliographies on students' reading lists</u> still comprise 95% of printed books and, in the case of the basic bibliography, are acquired (not always the case with complementary bibliographies). The number of available copies for each title, however, <u>no longer satisfies the ratios established for groups of students</u> and only one or two new copies have been acquired.







ACQUISITIONS 2013: BUDGET FOR ELECTRONIC JOURNALS AND RESOURCES

The following section shows the electronic collections available and their frequency of use (downloads). This is approximate data given that the statistics come from the same publishers who provide varying interpretations of existing standards (Counter). Among those not included, therefore, is Springer (which changed its calculation formula this year), OCDE library, Wiley...




The electronic books which recieved the most use were scientific-technical and business manuals via the Safari platform, most used by students, and following that, the IEEE standards, norms and Conferences





In both absolute and relative numbers, highest use was made of journals from Elsevier, thus representing a number of downloads almost equal to all other platforms together.

Furthermore, while there was an increase in downloads, the number of titles available remained the same. The case of Proquest and its increased use has to do with the increase of titles and ease of current access via the new Library search engine (distributed by the same company).




Having different characteristics, the Web of Science is not included in the previous tables. It had 147,129 downloads in 2013.


PROPORTIONAL USE OF FEE-BASED ELECTRONIC SCIENTIFIC DOCUMENTATION AT UC3M

Highest use occurs among those resources most related to research: scientific journals from Elsevier and IEEE, manuals available on the Safari platform used by students, and resources of legislation and jurisprudence at Aranzadi especially utilized by Law students.



In order to consult and search for all this information (audiovisual books and journals held in libraries or digital books, journals or documents), tools are provided such as **the search engine,catalogue, e-resources website and the e-archive**

During its first year, the new Library Search Engine achieved the following results



Available work and study places have increased with the addition of the new building for Humanities, Communication and Documentation Library. For the academic year of 2012/2013, statistics indicated a shift from 8 to 7 students for every place available

Student attendance at libraries began to decline in 2012 after budget cuts led to a <u>reduction</u> <u>in opening hours</u> during exam periods. The reduction has continued during 2013 with the closure of libraries on weekends and the elimination of late-night opening hours during exam periods.


Another influential factor is the decline in total number of students arising from the gradual elimination of the former degree system, as occurred for example, with the cancellation of September exams.

One interesting fact about this part of the Public Service that we belong to is that **despite the increasing decline in spending on the library**, **each visit from a user is becoming "more expensive" as there are less people being attended to.**

Despite this decline, the number of users to have visited the library during the year 2013 reached a Total of 1,120,191

It is noteworthy that contrary to common perception, there is an ongoing <u>increase in laptop</u> <u>loans</u> requested by students. A student spends many hours at university and does not always have access to a computer or cannot bring his or her own, even if there is an everincreasing need for a computer.




The budget cuts, however, mean that we cannot purchase more of these devices and are not always able to replace them when they break down.



The number of documents loaned has shrunk by 5%, in line with the previously mentioned decline in the total amount of students



The interlibrary loan service provides documents found in other Spanish or foreign centres that are needed by our students. This is a service mainly geared towards the Teaching and Research Faculty(PDI in Spanish) and also Postgraduate students. This material arrives by copy or loan via reciprocal agreements between libraries.



Documents are likewise provided from UC3M to other external libraries as requested.

The **retrieval rate** for all documents requested by our users was 93.51%. Only 6.49% of requests were not located.

Average response times continue to decrease. In 2013, it took an average of four days to locate the material requested by users, order it from external centres, and then receive and deliver it.

Learning support

Student training – Degree level

Formal training and development provided by the Library to degree-level students is integrated into the subject *Search Techniques and Use of Information* and is compulsory for all students (3 credits ECTS).

This collaboration with the Department of Library Science and Documentation continued throughout 2013.

Training and development in Human Resources Program for teaching, research and administrative staff

The Library collaborates with the Department of Human Resources in order to provide a selection of professional training and development options for teaching and research faculty.

In general, the results may be regarded as very positive: 15 courses have been given to 215 teachers on subjects as diverse as:

- Design of Moocs
- Camtasia
- Social Web
- EU Information
- Accreditation and the Evaluation Process for Researchers
- Social Networks...

In order to assist in the Postgraduate students' learning process, web pages have been created for the subject **Master's Degree Final Project.** These pages include recommendations and guidelines in searching for information, its evaluation and organization, as well as academic writing and available applications or tools.

Throughout 2013 there was ongoing support for innovation in teaching such as the creation of Moocs, *Cursos Cero*, as well as recordings of courses or workshops for Aula Global, etc. Together with Computer Services, the Library continued to supervise the development of these activities, carrying out technical control, subtitles and content uploads on the platform.

Recording booths have been set up in the libraries themselves in order to develop these courses. These booths are available in the Social Sciences Library (Getafe) and the School of Engineering Library (Leganes).

UC3M teachers now have 209 courses published in the program Open Course Ware. The Quality Commission for the OCW Project has initiated a validation system for the new courses, one which is based on a series of quality criteria and which uses a peer review process. Of the 30 new courses presented, 18 have passed the evaluation and have been published.

Research support

The working group for the support of research and transference began to provide services in the year 2012 after identifying a series of specific needs in these two areas. Close collaboration with Research Services has been vital in detecting the priority actions and needs most adequate to these areas and to the present moment.

2. Participation in preparing the **Research Report** 2011-2012.



In general, the year's indicators serve to highlight the declining performance of those areas that depend on resources effected by cuts.

Not only has service had to be provided to a new centre but also to the extension of another building and with the same amount of Human resources as before. It is, however, a positive indicator that the number of students per work place has decreased from 8 to 7 with the increase of building space.

At the same time, the same number of staff are carrying out more tasks as a result of Library involvement in the area of Educative technology (Moocs, *cursos cero..*) or management of university research: quality of publications in the processes of accreditation or research-based pay rises.

Because less publications are acquired, there are fewer loans or consultations (fewer documents provided). Students also have fewer copies of basic bibliographies. Book/student ratios which were established years ago in the Library are no longer met and, with the cancellation of journals, teachers and researchers have less access to the latest scientific journals.

It is also noteworthy that a reduction in opening times means a decrease in users visiting the library (which is no longer open on weekends and does not have a late-night timetable for the exam period). Curiously, it may be observed that within our area of the public service, while less money is spent on the library, the decreasing number of visits means that every visit costs more money.
